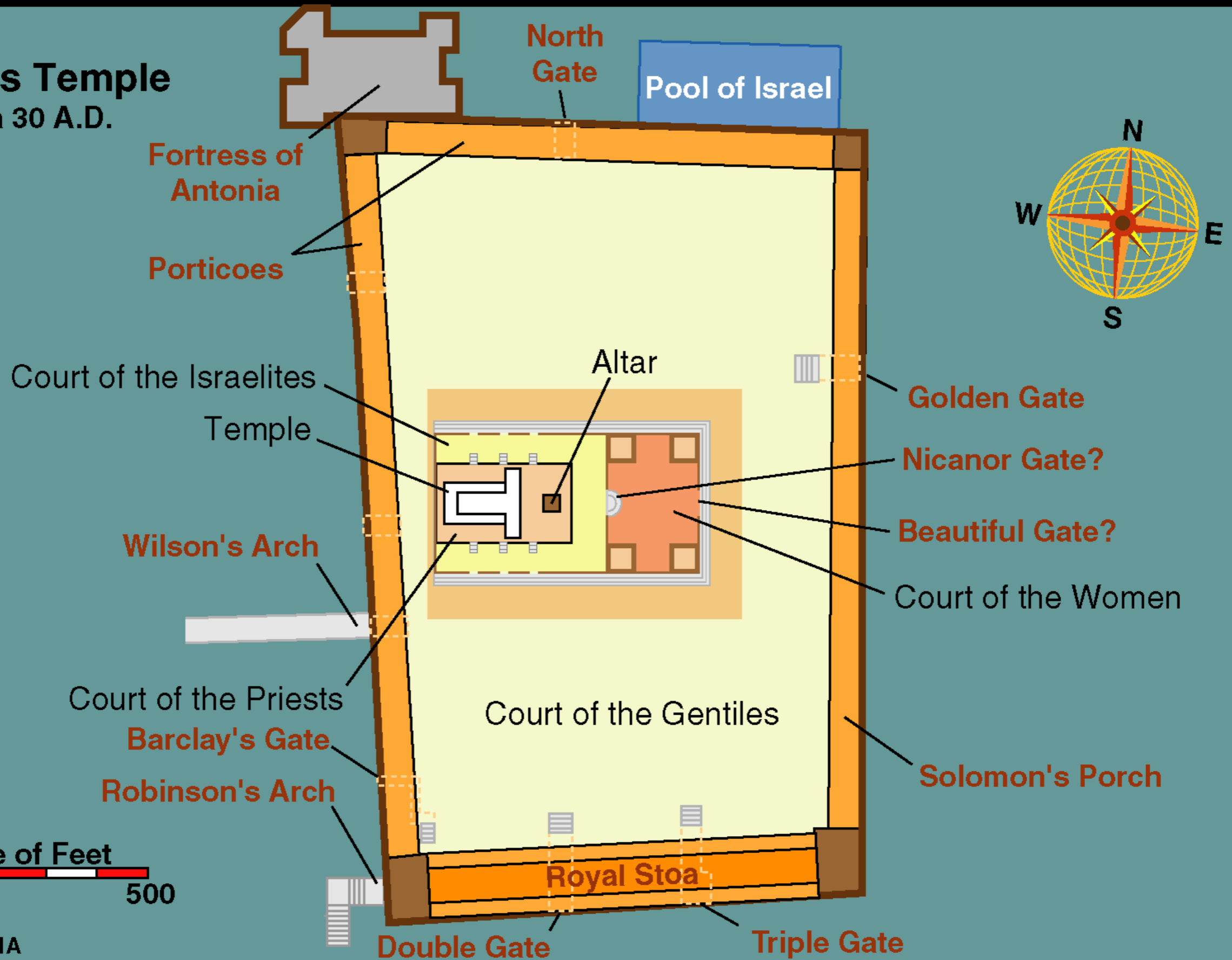

Herod's Temple circa 30 A.D.



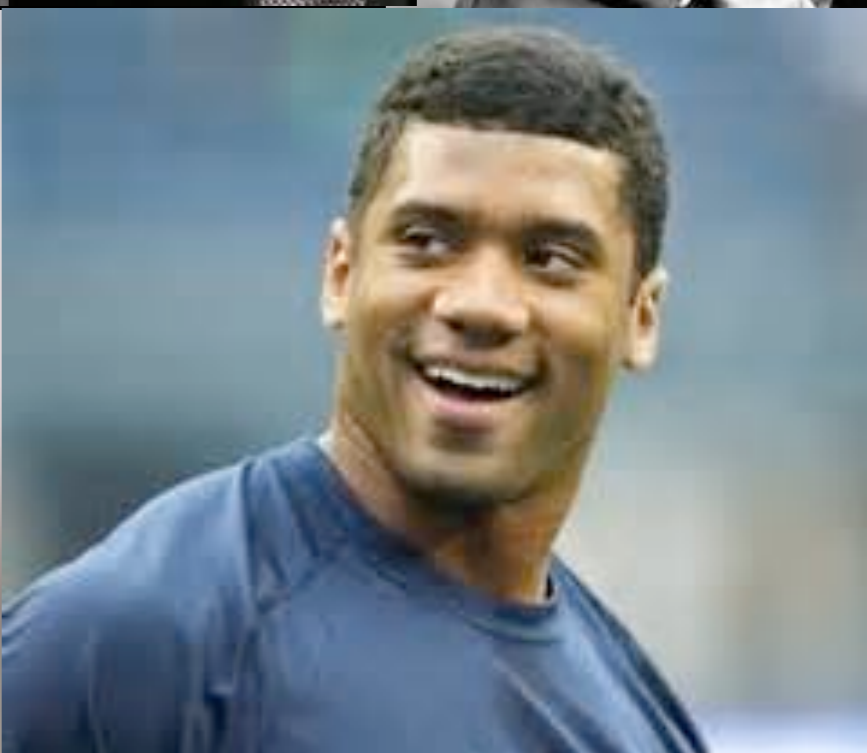
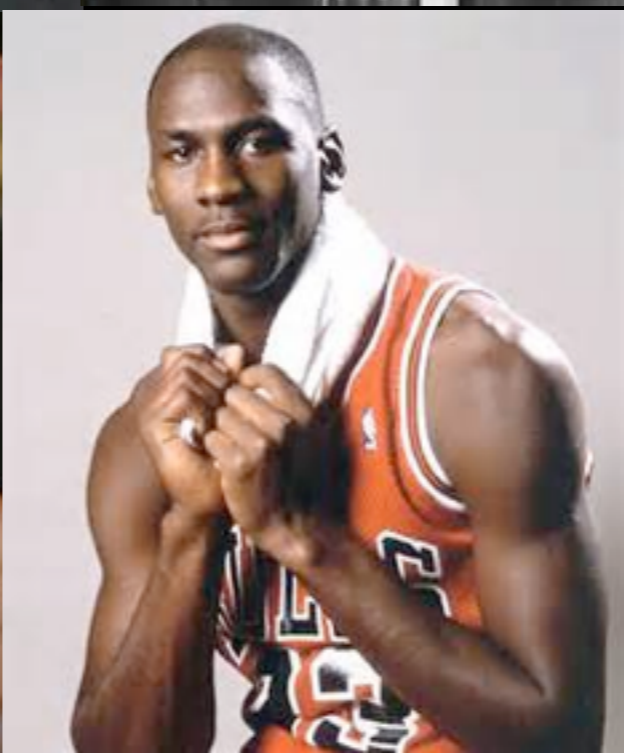
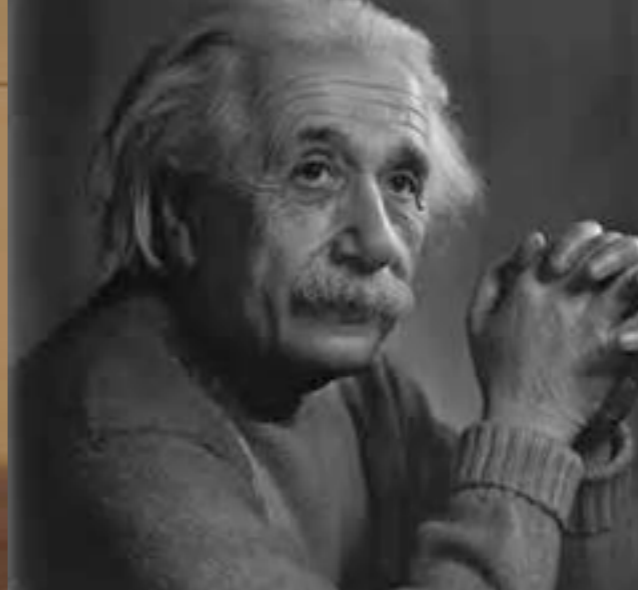

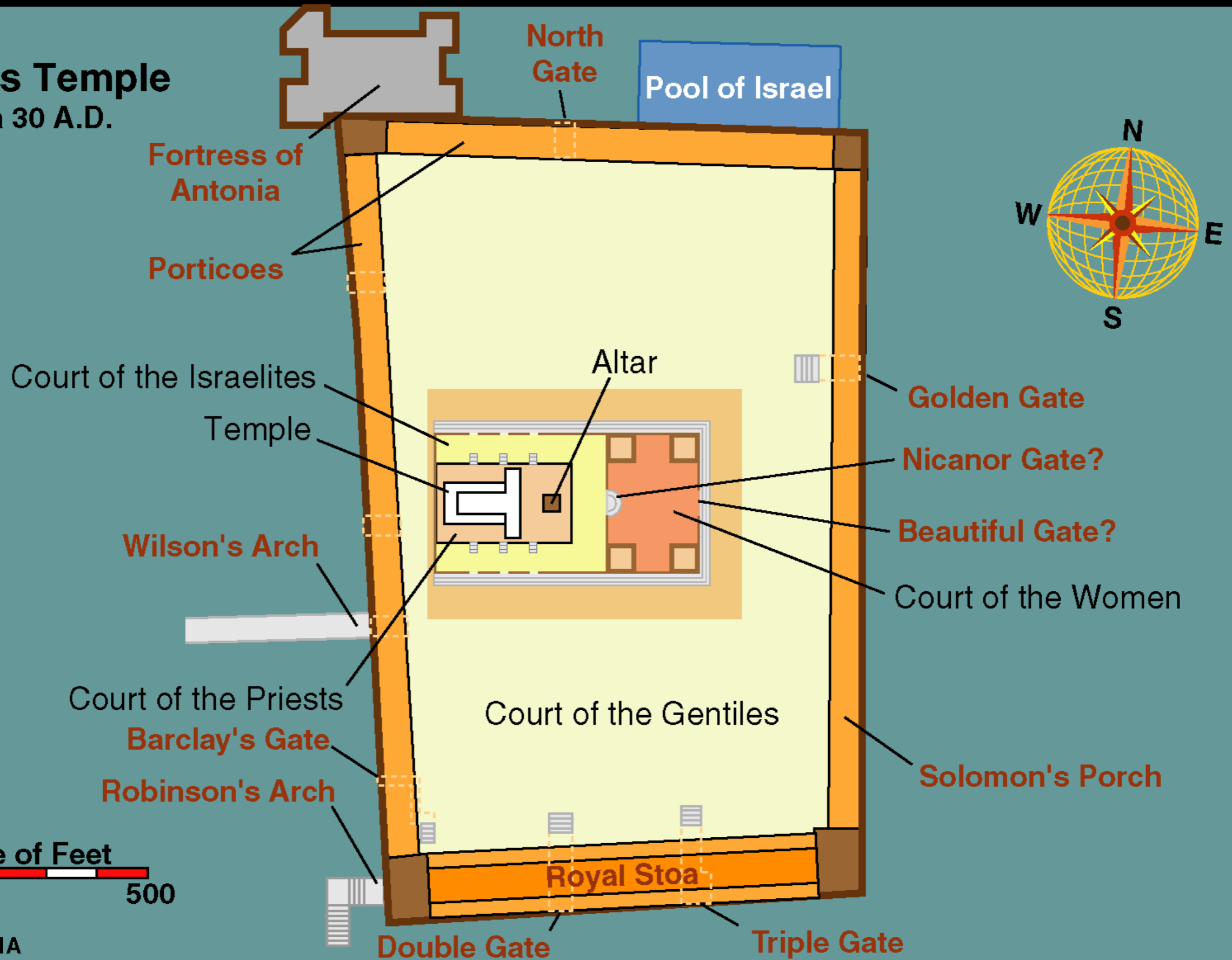
And they began selling their property and possessions and were sharing them with all, **as anyone might have need**. (Acts 2:45)
