## Eph 2:1-3 (ESV)

<sup>1</sup> And you were dead in the trespasses and sins <sup>2</sup> in which you once walked, following the **course** of this world, following the prince of the **power of the air**, the **spirit** that is now at work in the **sons of disobedience**— <sup>3</sup> among whom we all once lived in the passions of our flesh, carrying out the desires of the body and the mind, and were by nature children of wrath, like the rest of mankind.

### Opposite prince

that He worked **in Christ** when He raised Him from the dead and **seated Him at His right hand** in the heavenly places, (Eph 1:20)

### Opposite spirit:

may give you the **Spirit of wisdom** and of revelation in the knowledge of Him, <sup>18</sup> having the eyes of your hearts enlightened (Eph 1:17-18)

### Opposite adoption:


for **adoption to Himself as sons** through Jesus Christ, according to the purpose of His will (Eph 1:5)

### Opposite character:

that we should be **holy and blameless** before Him (Eph 1:4)

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## Matt 3:7-9 (ESV)

<sup>7</sup> But when he saw many of the Pharisees and Sadducees coming to his baptism, he said to them, “You **brood of vipers!** Who warned you to flee from the wrath to come? <sup>8</sup> Bear fruit in keeping with repentance. <sup>9</sup> And do not presume to say to yourselves, ‘We have Abraham as our father,’...

Eph 2:4-10 (ESV)

But God, being rich in mercy, because of the great love with which He loved us, <sup>5</sup> even when we were dead in our trespasses, made us alive together with Christ—by grace you have been saved— <sup>6</sup> and raised us up with Him and seated us with Him in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus, <sup>7</sup> so that in the coming ages He might show the immeasurable riches of his grace in kindness toward us in Christ Jesus. <sup>8</sup> For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, <sup>9</sup> not a result of works, so that no one may boast. <sup>10</sup> For we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them.

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**παράπτωμα** **paraptōma**, *par-ap'-to-mah*; a side-slip (lapse or deviation), i.e. (unintentional) error or (wilful) transgression:—fall, fault, offence, sin, trespass.

**ὑπερβάλλω** **hupēballō**, *hoop-er-bal'-lo*; to throw beyond the usual mark, i.e. (fig.) to surpass (only act. part. *supereminent*):—exceeding, excel, pass.

**ποίημα** **pōiēma**, *poi'-ay-mah*; a product, i.e. fabric (lit. or fig.):—thing that is made, workmanship.
