I. It takes too much time and effort

If you read 85 verses a day, you can read the whole Bible in a year.

An average reader can do this comfortably in **20 minutes**.

If you attend all services on Sunday and one mid-week class, you are committing a total of 6 hours a week (that includes an avg. 20 min commute each way).

That is 3.5% of your time every week committed to study and worship

collectively.


