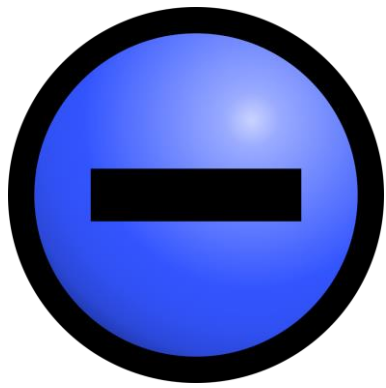
WE CAN'T TRUST OUR HEARTS

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**Be miserable and mourn
and weep; let your
laughter be turned into
mourning and your joy
to gloom. (Jas 4:9)**

Those who **sow in tears shall reap with joyful shouting.
He who goes to and fro weeping, **carrying his bag of
seed**, shall indeed come again with a shout of joy,
bringing his sheaves with him. (Ps 126:5-6)**
